founder and director and senior physician, Dr. Keren Doenyas-Barak of the PTSD unit at the Sagol Center for Hyperbaric Medicine and Research, which is at the forefront of research and treatment for post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD). We will hear about the groundbreaking work being done in the realm of trauma and specifically those who

survived the Nova music festival and Swords of Iron.

(We remain hopeful that all the hostages will have been released by this time, and if so, we will meet with representatives of the released hostages (to hear their stories and of the struggle of the <u>Bring Them Home Forum</u>) and the role of civic leadership at a

leadership? What was their strength?

Today we will travel south to get a sense of the magnitude of destruction on October 7 and the resilience of those that lived through those days and thereafter

terrible loss of life and the horrors of that day

Meet with senior professionals at Abraham Initiatives, an NGO working to fulfill the promise of full and equal citizenship and complete equality of social and political rights for Israel's Jewish and Arab citizens, through change of public policy.

Walk and observe the different communities in this mixed city and learn about the work of the Abraham Initiatives in working to strengthen the socio-economic base of the city and creating safer cities

encountered in the legislative process and the overall importance of the Knesset as

the foundation of the State of Israel's vibrant democracy

controversial decision

peoples, flavors and cultures. Meet up for lunch at Azura or Steakiat Hatzot restaurant

2 p.m. A Window into Hareidi Society

Depart for the ArtShelter Gallery to meet with director and curator Dr. Noa Lea Cohn, the first community gallery dedicated to the ultra-Orthodox. What inspired them to establish the gallery? What is unique about a Hareidi art gallery? How does the gallery

interface with the wider community?

4 p.m. Depart for the Maaleh film school- through the media of film we will view and discuss

the short documentaries or movies prepared by graduating students of the film school

The films will focus on security and diverse society.
